Objective and Methodology

The Globe reached out to our Insiders to learn more about their personal investing as well as their concerns about their investment portfolio in a possible recession.

We asked them about:

- Their investments and what institutions held them
- Where they acquire investing information
- If they planned to liquidate or invest more in a recession
- Whether they used a financial advisor
- If they didn't have a financial advisor, were they planning to hire one

Survey Period:

October 14 - 27, 2022

Survey Participants:

1,457 respondents (39% response rate)

Summary

Globe readers are heavily invested – 98% have some form of investment

- Nearly 75% of readers own stocks
- At least half of readers hold savings accounts, RRSPs and mutual finds
- At least one third of readers hold pension funds, ETFs, fixed-income securities, or bonds
- One third also report holding crypto currency, real estate or a commodity as an investment

Newspapers are #1 for financial information and investing advice

- The next top resources consulted are financial experts, business and financial magazines (online and print), financial websites, online searches and investment companies
- Roughly two-thirds of readers utilize a financial advisor and the other onethird do not
- 5% of readers are looking for a financial advisor

Globe readers are concerned about a possible recession but wil CA1 intain their investments and/or add to their portfolios

- 67% say they are somewhat or moderately concerned about how a recession will impact their investments
- About 6 out of 10 will maintain their portfolio (not liquidate any part of it)
- 58% say they will likely invest further despite a recession
- Of those planning to invest, stocks were cited most often followed by ETFs, savings and mutual funds
